EPIPHANY 2020

- 1. News and Events
 - a. <u>Annual Vestry Meetings</u>: please pray for all congregations preparing reports and budgets and conducting their Annual Vestry meetings in the next couple of months.
 - b. <u>The Church of the Epiphany</u> PARISH AND COMMUNITY EVENTS & ANNOUNCEMENTS
 - (1) THIS SUNDAY we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, a Christian festival commemorating the occasion when Joseph and Mary, in obedience to Jewish law, went to the Temple in Jerusalem both to be purified 40 days after the birth of Mary's son, Jesus, and to present him to God as her firstborn (Luke 2:22–38), following Jewish religious custom. Mary and Joseph sacrificed two turtledoves and it was there that they encountered the priest Simeon who prayed what became called the Nunc Dimittis (Canticle of Simeon), which prophesied the redemption of the world by Jesus. Simeon held the baby in his arms and said that he would be a light for the Gentiles (Luke 2:32). The Prophetess Anna was also there and she offered up prayers and praises to God for the redemption that Jesus would bring.
 - (2) CORONA VIRUS The Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada, Archbishop Linda Nicholls, has issued a statement concerning the need for diligent hygienic practices in face of

growing concern surrounding the new Corona virus. For those of you concerned about receiving communion from the "common cup" the Primate reminds us that receiving Communion in "one kind" (ie, bread only) is considered a full communion. If you decide that method for yourself, when the cup is offered to you, simply touch its base or cross your arms over your heart. We discourage intinction (ie, dipping the wafer into the wine). Also, please use the hand sanitizer available before coming to communion. The Primate's full letter in this regard is posted in the Algoma Room.

- (3) BOOK SALE SUCCESS The monies raised from last weekend's book sale amounted to an even \$3000! This money will help to fund the parish's outreach endeavours. Thanks again to those who helped out, as well as to all of you who donated books and/or bought books. we thank you for donating and buying books!

Synod session called to provide advice to the Archbishop on same sex marriage in the Diocese of Algoma.

Algoma Special Synod for May 8, 2020 in Sault Ste. Marie A Synod session called to provide advice to the Archbishop on the place of same sex marriage in the life of our Diocese.

Recent developments at the national level of our Church mean that the decision as to whether or not same sex marriages are to take place in the dioceses of the Anglican Church of Canada are now to be made in those dioceses by their Bishop. For Algoma, this responsibility rests with our Archbishop.

Over the last year, the Archbishop has made a commitment that she will only make this decision, which she now must make, after listening carefully to the prayerful advice of the people of our Diocese.

To enable this to happen the Archbishop has called Regional Gatherings to be held across the Diocese at which this will be discussed, and has called a Special Session of our Synod to follow these Gatherings.

She has asked the Special Session of our Synod to provide her with advice about the place same sex marriage will hold in the life of our Diocese. This Special Synod session has now been called for Friday, May 8, to do this. <u>See the attached document</u> for the MEMORANDUM To Diocesan Clergy and Lay Delegates to Synod.
