Bishop-elect Maria Grace, a priest from the Diocese of Tokyo, was elected to her new role in November 2021, at the 80th Synod of the Diocese of Hokkaido, and consecrated as bishop on Saturday, April 23. Her election was welcomed at the time by Mandy Marshall, Director for Gender Justice at the Anglican Communion Office, as “a real breakthrough”.

 - i. **Archbishop Justin Welby apologizes to the Indigenous peoples of Canada**
Archbishop of Canterbury, the Most. Rev. Justin Welby, delivered an apology at an Indigenous gathering in Prince Albert, Sask., during his visit to Canada.

"Instead of advocating for you, we became complicit in, and often directly responsible for, residential schools.... [The] chasm between what could have been and what is, is shaming and devastating. It has led to the attempted liquidation of intergenerational links, culture, spirituality and much more.... And so I will make some hesitant commitments. I understand we need to match action with words."

The apology above was delivered at Prince Albert Exhibition on Sunday, May 1.
