Archbishop Anne Germond is pleased to announce the appointment of the Rev. Claire Miller as Incumbent of Christ Church (Lively) and St. John the Divine (Copper Cliff) effective January 5th, 2023.

Rev. Claire is presently serving as the Incumbent for Holy Trinity (Sault Ste. Marie) and as Regional Dean for Algoma Deanery. She has been a priest in the church for over 20 years. She has close ties with Manitoulin Island where she grew up so she is very familiar with all things Algoma. She enjoys working with children and young people and sees herself as an 'ambassador of reconciliation' with indigenous peoples. Fostering positive relationships within the parish setting is very important to her as is her relationship with ecumenical faith communities.

<u>Please note</u>: at the last Deanery Council Meeting, the following discussion happened around communication within Sudbury-Manitoulin Deanery:

Concern has been expressed that our current webpage and Facebook page "manager" is no longer resident in the deanery, not even in the country. Posts that have been considered to be "Personal" posts have been posted on the Facebook page and more from the Church of England and not so much Deanery or Anglican Church of Canada content.

Marion Collinson has volunteered to take over the Facebook Page management and will find others from other parishes to assist, this will allow parishes at the local level to post their upcoming events etc. on the page without having to go through another person.

The website is meant to be a basic one where people can find info on service times etc.

<u>Deanery Digest</u> – is getting quite lengthy but most of the content is not Deanery related. Should we continue to send it weekly or just on an "as needed" basis. People have asked to be unsubscribed because the information is not relevant to the deanery/them.

Concern over switching and not sending e-mails is reaching those not on Facebook.

Perhaps we can change it to monthly and have a set deadline of say the 15th of each month for submissions, and then the Digest can be distributed on the 1st of each month.

This conversation will shift to Deanery Clericus, who meet monthly.
