Dear friends in Sudbury/ Manitoulin deanery

All across the Diocese of Algoma this Thanksgiving, people are *Lifting up their Hearts* in celebration of God's goodness and generosity. In Bishop Stephen's charge to Synod this year he invited us all engage in a season of 'gratitude', and it began officially on October 4th.


Deanery News

1. The Fall Deanery Council

The Deanery Council meeting takes place at the Church of the Epiphany on Saturday 17th October. Coffee time will be at 9:30am with the opening Eucharist at 10am. Clergy, Wardens, Synod delegates, and treasurers are all invited to attend this important meeting. Barbara Ingram will be installed as the Warden of Layreaders for the deanery, and the Rev. Doug Prebble as Regional Dean. Tom Linck and Gilles Tessier will be installed as the Lay Stewards at this meeting. This also serves as a reminder that any property matters which need to go to the November Executive Committee meeting, must be approved of by the Deanery officials, and be at the Synod office three weeks before the meeting. The deadline for applications for the November 4th meeting is the week after Thanksgiving.

2. A Visit from Bishop Mwita Akiri – October 26th – 27th.

We are delighted that Bishop Mwita Akiri from the Diocese of Tarime in Tanzania, our partner Diocese, will be visiting our deanery on Monday 26th and Tuesday 27th October. Bishop Stephen will bring him to Sudbury on Monday and that afternoon he will be giving a lecture at Thorneloe University to the Religious Studies students. On Tuesday morning he will visit the Elgin Street Mission, where so many of us participate in outreach activities, and also have a tour of Barrydowne College, an alternative High School which the Ascension supports. At noon Bishop Mwita will join the Sudbury clericus for their monthly meeting.

On Tuesday evening at 5pm you are all invited to the Ascension for a potluck supper and conversation with Bishop Mwita and Bishop Stephen. This is a great opportunity for us to get to know Bishop Mwita, whom one of the lay readers in my parish describe as energetic, interesting and interested in all aspects of our diocesan life. 3. A Visit from the Sisters of St. John the Divine

Joining us at the Deanery Council meeting in October will be two sisters from the Sisters of St. John the Divine in Toronto. Sr. Constance Joanna and Sister Louise will be given some time to speak about their ministry and work. Later that afternoon, at 3:30pm they will be speaking at the Thorneloe Chapel about a new program the Sisterhood of St. John the Divine is planning. For some years the sisters have had an "Alongsiders'" program at St. John's Convent in Toronto where women can spend a year (or two in some cases) living, praying, working, and creating community with the Sisters.

Sister Constance writes: The goals of the Alongsider program are mutual - the Alongsiders use their unique gifts and skills as they assist in the Sisterhood's ministry and are formed in the ancient-future monastic values that they can take back into their lives in families, churches, school, and work places;

and the sisters experience their own formation, as we learn from our Alongsiders how God is calling us to transform our own community life and ministry to the changing needs of the church and God's world.

Beginning in the fall of 2016, we are planning to morph the Alongsider program into something more intentionally along the lines of the new monasticism. We wish to invite young women to spend a year with us, forming community within their own cohort and also with the sisters, deepening their own life in Christ as they assist the sisters in reaching out to the world God loves.

The Sisterhood's Intention, as expressed in our Rule of Life, is as follows:

Our Rule is based on the Rule of Benedict, and we seek a balance between the contemplative and active life.

You are warmly invited to attend this presentation at the Thorneloe Chapel and asked to forward this to anyone who might be interested. The sisters will be preaching at the Eucharist at Deanery Council and at the Church of the Epiphany and the Church of the Ascension on the 18th October.


The women of the various ACW groups in our deanery will be planning the ACW Annual meeting next May (30th – June 1st)
